Amanohashidate Winery

Chionji Temple 智恩寺

One of the three main Monju Bosatsu (Bodhisattva) worship sites in Japan. According to legend, the Monju Bosatsu was enshrined at Chionji Temple after successfully using its wisdom to civilize and reform a destructive dragon. This legend is reenacted in the Monjuodo Defune Festival held annually in July.



Amanohashidate Specialty "Chie no Mochi"

Chie no Mochi, or white rice cake topped with azuki (red bean) paste, can be eaten at any of the four tea houses lining the street in front of Chionji Temple. There is an ancient superstition stating that those who eat this special rice cake will be gifted with wisdom.
